Music Notes

▫The Prelude is an organ piece that features the Harmonic Flute stop on the organ. Due to its particular construction, the Harmonic Flute becomes more prominent as it goes up in range, allowing for the top melody to sing out over the texture as if being played by an orchestral flute. The middle section starts with the melody in the pedals, then accumulates the foundation stops of the organ to create a rich sonority full of texture and depth, to then have the Harmonic Flute return over an extended pedal point.
