This month we will wrap up our sermon series on Jonah, and I don't know about you, but I have learned a lot about this powerful little book. It is only 4 chapters long, but it contains many significant lessons as well as some quite humorous puns.

The chapter that I have found the most compelling though has been chapter 2 – Jonah's prayer in the belly of the big fish. It made me think about my own prayer life and the way that I often come to God with an agenda. It's easy to be like Jonah and hide behind the "right words" of a prayer without your heart really invested in the process.

But prayer can be so intimidating right? And I'm just talking about individual, private prayer. To ask someone to pray out loud is a whole other can of worms! But regardless of your comfort level with praying in front of folks, praying FOR folks is essential to the life of faith. I like how pastor Barbara Brown Taylor puts it,

"To say I love God but I do not pray much is like saying I love life but I do not breathe much."

Praying should be like breathing. Every Sunday after the children's message before I dismiss the kiddos to go with Ms. Susie, we pray together. And every Sunday I ask them to fold their hands and close their eyes when we talk to God. I think that posture of prayer, especially for wiggly preschoolers, can be really helpful. However, sometimes I fear that those instructions limit our imaginations of what prayer can be. It's not just sitting down criss-cross-applesauce and formulating a prayer that sounds good.

When we pray we are invited into a two-way conversation. We get to speak to God, but we also get to LISTEN to God, and that can happen at any time. So much of listening requires us to simply pay attention. What is God doing in us and around us? How is God moving here at FPC? What is working and what might be ready for transformation in our lives and in our church?

These are a few of the questions we'll tackle during our First Things First Sunday gatherings. The two words I've been using to describe this time together is informal and intentional. Prayer doesn't have to be "fancy", but it does have to be purposeful. So we'll be setting aside time each month to pray together. I hope you and your family will join us! Mark your calendars:

All adult Sunday school classes will meet in the Fellowship Hall. All children and youth will meet upstairs in the Drama room.


